Program Guidelines & Activities

Who Can Apply (Community Advocates)

To **apply** to Re-Take Oakland, you must be:

- An Oakland resident

Priority will go towards the following:

- Demographics:
 - Asian Americans (including South, East, Southeast, and West Asian/Middle Eastern)
 - LGBTQ+ people of color
 - Mixed race people
- Volunteer or Paid Work:
 - Have a history of taking community action by working with neighbors in Oakland

Program Goals

- Commit to participating in a 2 year community advocacy program.
- Year One
 - Work with an emerging filmmaker of color to develop a local personal story about individuals, families and/or communities (not necessarily auto-biographical) for a 5-10 minute documentary film.
- Year Two
 - Work with filmmaker to strategize distribution for the short film and organize a local screening to include providing support for marketing, outreach, and community partnerships.

Program Activities

 - Three public film screenings followed by private dialogues with filmmakers.
 - Finding Kukan with Robin Lung (June 30)
 - Marlon Riggs' Tongues Untied with Vivian Kleiman (August 2)
 - Little White Lie with Lacey Schwartz (August 18)
 - Three master classes
 - Producing personal story films (July)

- Story development and structure (September)
 - Editing personal stories (January)
 - Small group mentoring sessions

 - Three public media education events
 - Three master classes
 - Small group mentoring sessions
